

The fine weather —has delayed work from starting well. Over time for men has caused small groups there. The girls club seems particularly difficult to start. The dancing here & at James Otis attracts them. Club organization does not so much.

Non-resident workers have come in pretty well. Mrs. Henry Hubbard starts a dramatic group.

The Basta family have assumed charge of De Marco Saloon. The latter moving away. We protested before the license man—but with no effect. They claim protection of Devereaux.

Polling place ntrated/started between Commons & Basta's store for two or three days but finally landed there on their promise to keep it clean & warm.
